





First things first, you need to find registration. Registration is the heart of the rally. information central so to speak. This year you will find registration to be inside the Desert Meeting Room at the Ambassador Conference Center. As with all things HOG you will be required to check in, present your current National Membership Card to make sure your current. If your National Membership needs renewed we will be able to help do that with you right there at registration. You will also fill out and sign a release form and present that as well. Once this is done you will move down the line and receive you Rally Registration Bag. Inside this bag are items you purchased during preregistration such as T-Shirt, patch, pin, tickets for the wine tour, closing ceremonies dinner coupon and even some surprises. It is your responsibility to check over your registration bag before you leave. If something is missing it needs to be brought up then. Some items such at tickets for dinners will NOT BE replaced once you leave the registration area. And, don't misplace them! Again, they will NOT BE replaced.

You will be given a wristband at registration as well. Your wristband is a KEY to all activities at the rally. You must have your wristband on to attend all events, and in some cases must also present a ticket or coupon as well. You will be asked to show your wristband many times during the rally. Remember that its not to annoy you, and the volunteers that are asking are

doing their jobs. It is proof that your a rally attendee, and that you have signed a release form.

You will be asked to show your wristband before the guided rides leave, at the ice cream meet and greet, for the pig roast on Friday plus the coupon you will receive. Lets just say its your responsibility to make sure you have it on, and have the coupons needed for the event your attending if required. Its all pretty simple really.

So, your ready to leave registration, you've checked you bag, everything is in order, tickets, coupons, rally guide book, swag, signed up for all the rides, and can't wait to enjoy the rally. Now get out there and enjoy all that the Rally Coordinators have worked all year on, that our volunteers have stepped up and are assisting us with, and all your friends are waiting to get out there and ride and have fun. Lets have a kick ass rally in Erie!

ZIPPO

There will be a ride to Zippo on Friday and on Saturday. Here is a little history of an iconic company.

George G. Blaisdell founded Zippo Manufacturing Company in 1932, and produced the first Zippo lighter in early 1933, being inspired by an Austrian cigarette lighter of similar design made by IMCO. It got its name because Blaisdell liked the sound of the word "zipper" and "zippo" sounded more modern.[] On March 3, 1936, a patent was granted for the Zippo lighter.

Zippo lighters became popular in the United States military, especially during World War II — when, as the company's web site says, Zippo "ceased production of lighters for consumer markets and dedicated all manufacturing to the US military". Period Zippos were made of brass, but Zippo used a black crackle finished steel during the war years because of metal shortages. While the Zippo Manufacturing Company never had an official contract with the military, soldiers and armed forces personnel insisted that base exchange (BX) and post exchange (PX) stores carry this sought-after lighter. While it had previously been common to have Zippos with authorized badges, unit crests and division insignia, it became popular among the American soldiers of the Vietnam War to get their Zippos engraved with personal mottos. These lighters are now sought after collector's items and popular souvenirs for visitors to Vietnam.

After World War II, the Zippo lighter became increasingly used in advertising by companies large and small

through the 1960s. Much of the early Zippo lighter advertising are works of art painted by hand, and as technology has evolved, so has the design and finish of the Zippo lighter. The basic mechanism of the Zippo lighter has remained unchanged.

In 2002, Zippo expanded its product line to include a variety of utility-style multi-purpose lighters, known as Zippo MPLs. This was followed in 2005 with the Outdoor Utility Lighter, known as the OUL. These lighters are fueled with butane. In August 2007, Zippo released a new butane lighter called the Zippo BLU.

A museum called "Zippo/Case visitors center" is located in Bradford, Pennsylvania, at 1932 Zippo Drive. This 15,000-square-foot (1,400 m²) building contains rare and custom made Zippo lighters, and also sells the entire Zippo line. The museum was featured on the NPR program Weekend Edition on Sunday, January 25, 2009. The museum also contains an enormous collection of Case knives. Since the Zippo company's 60th anniversary in 1992, annual editions have been produced for Zippo collectors.

From 1949 to 2002, Zippos were also produced in Niagara Falls, Ontario, Canada. Since 1933, over 500,000,000 Zippo lighters have been produced.

In 2009, Zippo announced plans to purchase Ronson Consumer Products Corporation, a long-time competitor in the lighter market. On February 3, 2010, the deal was finalized.

In March 2011, due to significant decrease of sales from 18 million lighters a year in the mid-1990s to about 12 million lighters a year recently, combined with increasing pressure on people not to smoke, Zippo Manufacturing Co. tried offering a wider variety of products using the Zippo name, such as watches, leisure clothing and eau de cologne. This strategy is similar to the success Victorinox Swiss Army Brands Inc. has had selling watches, luggage, clothing and fragrance.

On June 5, 2012, the company manufactured its 500,000,000th lighter as well as celebrated its 80th anniversary.

Zippo embodies American pride not only in its design and manufacturing, but also through partnerships with companies and brands that share its patriotic values. More than half of the brands on the Brand Keys list have been featured on a Zippo lighter, including Jeep which came in at number one. In fact, in 2011, West Coast Customs produced a custom Zippo Jeep. In addition, Harley-Davidson Motor Company, ranked 13 on the list, is currently Zippo's number one licensed brand.
